

Brookville Board of Park Trustees
Regular Meeting
July 13, 2021

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville Board of Park Trustees was called to order by President Haney at 7:30 p.m. on July 13, 2021 in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Trustees Cordes and Vance; Clerk Duncan, Council Liaison Fowler and Manager Keaton were present. Member Blevins was absent.

Roll call by President Haney.

Motion by Vance, second by Cordes to approve the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Cordes, second by Vance to approve the June 8, 2021 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Council Liaison Fowler reported the outline for the Gaga Ball Pit is in place and asked if weed control can be applied before the pit is installed on Saturday.

Manager Keaton advised she will have the service department take care of it, weather permitting.

Council Liaison Fowler reported the soccer season will start soon. The Board is planning a parade for opening day.

Manager Keaton reported Park Permits are up \$14,493 through June 30, compared to this same time last year. Adult Softball League Fees are up \$4,400 through this same time last year.

Manager Keaton reported the asphalt is down for the CDBG Golden Gate Walking Path Project. When the rain stops, they will feather out the edges, plant seed and remove the fencing. They will also be installing ADA ramps on the corners and signage that prohibits motorized vehicles on the walking path.

Manager Keaton reported the electric project at Golden Gate is almost complete. They just need to feather out the dirt pile where the conduit was laid, which will also happen when the rainy weather breaks.

Manager Keaton reported the Brookville Chamber of Commerce donated the money to replace the damaged crawl tube at the Golden Gate Castle playground. Manager Keaton stated she had originally reported it is a tube slide, but it is actually a crawl tube.

Manager Keaton reported this is the third playset damaged this year by vandalism. The playset at the Pee Wee Football field was damaged as well and she is in the process of ordering replacement boards.

Manager Keaton reported there are local and State Fire Marshall regulations on mobile food truck vendors and any future requests for food trucks at the parks will go through the Brookville Fire Department.

Manager Keaton reported she is still looking at the possibility of a donation box at Golden Gate Park as a future project.

Manager Keaton stated as mentioned previously, the area for the Gaga Ball Pit was marked off and weed control will be applied prior to the installation.

Manager Keaton reported Council voted to put a street levy back on the November ballot, but no park levy at this time.

Manager Keaton reported the Service Department will be setting up the snow fence this week for the fireworks display at the 70th Annual Community Picnic. Manager Keaton encouraged everyone to attend.

Trustee Cordes had no report.

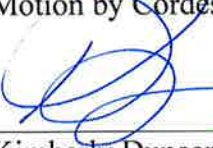

The Victory Project is an inner-city ministry that works with high-school aged young men to teach them life skills. Trustee Vance suggested the city use the Victory Project for projects around town to take the load off our maintenance department.

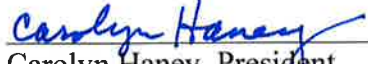
Manager Keaton replied she would look into the Victory Project. The youths would need to be at least 18 years old to do any work for the city.
