

Brookville Board of Park Trustees
Regular Meeting
May 10, 2022

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville Board of Park Trustees was called to order by President Blevins at 7:30 p.m. on May 10, 2022 in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Trustees Cordes, Haney and Vance; Council Liaison Fowler, Manager Keaton and Clerk Duncan were present.

Roll call by President Blevins.

Motion by Haney, second by Cordes to approve the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Cordes, second by Haney to approve the April 12, 2022 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Manager Keaton reported Park Permits are up \$2,501 and donations are up \$8,987 compared to April of 2021. Manager Keaton reported last week we received a \$10,345 donation from the Dayton Foundation through the Strausburg Foundation. This donation will be used toward the electric extension from the Castle Playground to three of the open-air shelters at Golden Gate Park.

Manager Keaton reported last year we received a generous donation to put a pickleball court on the tennis courts at Westbrook Park. Image Pavement hopes to wrap up the project by the end of next week, weather permitting.

Manager Keaton reported the basketball court upgrade is complete at Ward Park, with new goals and asphalt installed.

Manager Keaton reported the Service Department is finishing up fertilizing at each of our parks and hope to begin spraying for weeds soon. They are a little behind this year due to the wet weather.

Manager Keaton reported the annual Huffman Spring Classic will return to Golden Gate Park on May 22, 2022. This event has been rescheduled several times due to the pandemic. The event consists of a ride down the Wolf Creek Bike Trail to Verona and back. The riders will have a box lunch at the park on their return.

Manager Keaton advised Brookville Elementary will be at Westbrook Parks on May 19, 23, 24 and 25 for their field days.

Manager Keaton reported Serve Brookville will take place on May 20 from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. A rain date is scheduled for May 23. Brookville Alumni will serve alongside the Brookville graduating Seniors staining the interior of the Castle Playground, laying mulch and painting shelters and gazebos at our various parks.

Manager Keaton reported the Covington FFA Advisor thanked Park Board for allowing them to use Golden Gate Park for the Day for the Dogs Event.

Manager Keaton reported RETREET donated seven good sized trees to the City as a thank you for staging the event here in Brookville. The trees were planted yesterday at Golden Gate Park.

Manager Keaton reported the number of softball teams in our Softball Program is down this year. There will be a men's church league on Monday, a women's church league on Tuesday and co-ed leagues on Wednesday and Friday. There will be no Sunday league this season.

Trustee Cordes had no report.

Trustee Haney reported she attended the Dog Day in the Park event. There was a terrific turnout this year and the park was cleaned up and left the way they found it.

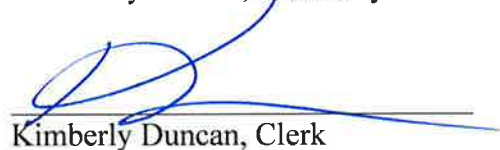
Trustee Haney stated she is thrilled about the new basketball court at Ward Park and the new electric that will be installed at Golden Gate Park.
