

Brookville Board of Park Trustees  
Regular Meeting  
July 12, 2022

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville Board of Park Trustees was called to order by President Blevins at 7:30 p.m. on July 12, 2022 in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Trustees Cordes, Haney and Vance; Manager Keaton and Clerk Duncan were present. Council Liaison Fowler was absent.

Roll call by President Blevins.

Motion by Haney, second by Vance to approve the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Cordes, second by Vance to approve the June 14, 2022 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Manager Keaton reported Park Permits are up \$4,470 and donations are up \$17,677 compared to June of 2021. League fees from the Adult Softball Program are down \$4,360 through June 30 of this year compared to this same time last year. Manager Keaton reported we are down \$6,500 from the same time period in 2018 and \$2,760 from the same time period in 2019. Manager Keaton advised we frequently go through an ebb and flow with the softball leagues, and it is likely the number of teams will go back up next year.

Manager Keaton reported the electric extension project at Golden Gate Park is complete and has passed inspection. Power is off in the panel and will be turned on when needed.

Manager Keaton reported the pickleball courts are completed. There are four pickleball courts on the Westbrook Park tennis courts and they are being utilized extensively. Users will need to provide their own nets and paddles.

Manager Keaton reported we recently found another slide damaged in the Castle Playground at Golden Gate Park. Two of these slides were replaced last year. Manager Keaton advised she believes kids are jumping up and down on the slides. She is looking at other playground items to replace the slides with.

Manager Keaton reported replacement parts for the lights in the women's restroom at Golden Gate Park have been ordered for over a year. About a month ago another light went out so she had Chase Electric replace those lights, and one in the alcove area that splits the restrooms. Everything should be functional now for the Community Picnic.

Manager Keaton reported the Service Department recently sprayed the volleyball courts and tilled them up. There has been some activity on those over the last month.

Manager Keaton reported the Service Department also trimmed back some trees in the cluster of the BBC diamonds. Manager Keaton reported some trees branches were growing through the backstops.

Manager Keaton stated she hopes the weather cooperates for the 71<sup>st</sup> Annual Community Picnic and encouraged everyone to attend. Manager Keaton reported the Service Department trimmed some low hanging branches and removed eleven dead trees at Golden Gate Park in preparation for the event.

Manager Keaton reported the Service Department also removed three overgrown pine trees in Gateway Park that were obstructing the view from the right turn lane.

Trustee Cordes shared some thank you letters she received from the Optimist Club for Park Board's assistance with the annual Easter Egg Hunt.

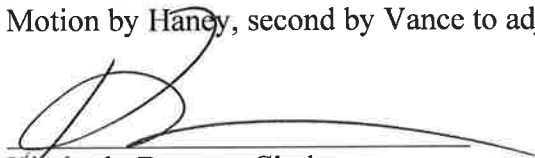
Trustee Haney had no report.
