

Brookville Board of Park Trustees
Regular Meeting
July 9, 2024

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville Board of Park Trustees was called to order by President Blevins at 7:30 p.m. on July 9, 2024 in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Trustees Cordes, Haney and Wilson; Council Liaison Fowler, Manager Kuntz and Clerk Duncan were present.

Roll call by President Blevins.

Motion by Haney, second by Cordes to approve the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Cordes, second by Wilson to approve the June 11, 2024 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Todd Clemmons, of Troop 47, reported they have been busy updating the scout building, including painting and installing LED lighting. They would like to put a scout related mural on the building.

Mr. Clemmons reported the scouts had planned on building the outdoor amphitheater with 8' x 8' wood, however, it is hard to find and cost prohibitive. The new plan is to use large landscaping stone for seating instead of wood or composite materials.

Discussion followed regarding the construction of the amphitheater.

Manager Kuntz reported park permits are at \$31,225 this year through June. The city has received \$1,010.00 in donations year-to-date through the month of May. Donations were at \$15,720.00 during the same period in 2023.

Manager Kuntz reported the installation of the new inclusive playground at Golden Gate Park has begun and should be completed in the next couple of weeks. Manager Kuntz reported this is the first phase of the design. The original design had to be paired back due to available resources.

Manager Kuntz reminded everyone of the Third Thursday event at Gruenig Park on July 18, 2024 from 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Manager Kuntz reported annual Brookville Community picnic is scheduled for July 25-July 27. Staff will be meeting with the Brookville Area Chamber of Commerce later this week to discuss and coordinate the logistics of the event.

Trustee Cordes had no report.

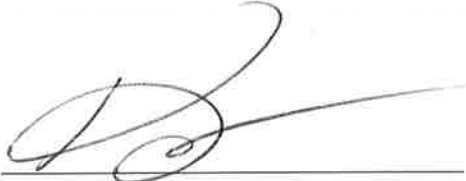
Member Haney stated the parking lot and the tennis courts at Golden Gate Park need to be resurfaced. The city should consider budgeting for this in the future.
