

Brookville Board of Park Trustees
Regular Meeting
September 10, 2024

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville Board of Park Trustees was called to order by President Blevins at 7:30 p.m. on September 10, 2024 in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Trustees Cordes, Haney and Wilson; Council Liaison Fowler, Manager Kuntz and Clerk Duncan were present.

Roll call by President Blevins.

Motion by Wilson, second by Cordes to approve the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Cordes, second by Wilson to approve the August 13, 2024 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

John Fugate, of the Adonai Service Group, proposed a fundraising event at Golden Gate Park to raise awareness and support for young girls who have been victims of human trafficking. The proceeds would go to the Grace Haven facility in Columbus, Ohio, which is the only facility in the state of Ohio that rehabilitates these young girls. The event will include gospel music, speakers, and food with a focus on collecting gift card donations for the girls in the facility. Mr. Fugate stated he has reached out to local churches and businesses for support and plans to attend a Brookville City Council Meeting for further assistance. Mr. Fugate requested the use of the gazebo/stage at Golden Gate Park on October 26, 2024 from 2:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m.

Motion by Cordes, second by Wilson to approve the Special Event Permit for the Adonai Service Group to hold a fundraiser and use the gazebo/stage at Golden Gate Park on October 26, 2024 from 2:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. All yeas, motion carried.

Damian Kristof, 61 Oak Street, expressed interest in involving the library in the planning of the Pumpkin Walk and the Ghostly Night Out event at Golden Gate Park.

President Blevins reported the Christmas in the Park kick-off event is set for December 6, 2024. Park Board Trustees should reach out to the groups and businesses who participated in last year's event. Trustees can also recruit interested new businesses and community organizations.

General discussion followed regarding goody bags, getting promotional items from local businesses, setting up decorations and potentially setting up an Amazon wish list for donations. A suggestion was made to decorate the inside of the Leiber Center. Purchasing additional decorations was also discussed. Decorating will take place the week before Thanksgiving,
