

Brookville Board of Park Trustees
Regular Meeting
July 8, 2025

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville Board of Park Trustees was called to order by President Blevins at 7:30 p.m. on July 8, 2025 in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Trustees Ledford and Wilson; Council Liaison Fowler, Manager Kuntz, and Clerk Duncan were present. Trustee Copley was absent.

Roll Call by President Blevins.

Motion by Wilson, second by Ledford to accept the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Ledford, second by Wilson to accept the June 10, 2025 Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Manager Kuntz reported park permits are at \$33,010 year-to-date and park donations remain at \$100 for 2025.

Manager Kuntz presented a request from Brave Church to hold a family movie night at Golden Gate Park on September 19, 2025. The event would be similar to the movie night held in 2023, with setup beginning at 5:00 p.m. and the movie shown from the gazebo beginning at dusk.

Motion by Ledford, second by Wilson to approve a family movie night in Golden Gate Park hosted by Brave Church on September 19, 2025 as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Manager Kuntz reminded everyone that the Age Friendly Lunch and Learn is scheduled for Thursday, July 17 at the Christena Leiber Center. Third Thursday will also take place that evening at Gruenig Park on Market Street, from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m.

Manager Kuntz reported staff recently submitted a \$50,000 grant application to the Small-Town grant program from T-Mobile in June. The grant application is for amenity upgrades at Gruenig Park and along Market Street to assist with creating an inviting and user-friendly environment for community programming in Historic Downtown Brookville.

Manager Kuntz reported the Leiber Center sidewalk replacement and expansion project at Golden Gate Park should begin after the Community Picnic. This project is being funded by a \$50,000 CDBG grant from Montgomery County.

Manager Kuntz reported a large portion of the parking lot at Golden Gate Park is scheduled to be resurfaced this month.

Manager Kuntz advised the Leiber Center ADA Restroom Upgrade project has been recommended for approval from the Montgomery County CDBG Board.
