

Brookville Board of Park Trustees
Regular Meeting
April 8, 2025

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville Board of Park Trustees was called to order by President Blevins at 7:30 p.m. on April 8, 2025 in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Trustees Copley and Ledford; Manager Kuntz, Council Liaison Fowler and Clerk Duncan were present. Member Wilson was absent. ,

Roll Call by President Blevins.

Motion by Ledford, second by Copley to accept the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Copley, second by Ledford to accept the March 11, 2025 Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Ben Peters, 9146 Stocker Road, Arcanum, requested approval of a Special Event Permit application for the Ball for Beckham Kickball Tournament on June 7, 2025 from 9:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. The charity tournament will be held on the softball fields at Golden Gate Park.

President Blevins reported the Market Street Connection has also applied for a Special Event Permit for the monthly Third Thursday event at Greunig Park, from April 17 through August 14, 2025.

Motion by Copley, second by Ledford to recommend Council approval of the 2025 Third Thursday dates as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Manager Kuntz reported park donations are still at \$100 for 2025 and park permits are at \$20,457.50 year to date.

Manager Kuntz reported the Optimist Club sent a thank you to Park Board for the use of Golden Gate Park for the Adult Egg Scramble. This event funds many activities that the Optimists put on for the public throughout the year.

Manager Kuntz reported the city was unable to find a ball diamond manager for the spring softball program this year. The Brookville Baseball Club will be maintaining and using the two extra fields for additional practice space and rainout games.

Manager Kuntz reported the Service Department recently added parking for an additional 20-30 vehicles at Golden Gate Park behind the t-ball fields.

Manager Kuntz reported staff submitted a grant application to the Dayton Foundation for wi-fi and a/v equipment at the Christena Leiber Center. This will help us attract speakers and other forms of entertainment for our expanding Age Friendly Lunch and Learn program and other future programs and events. Staff plans to submit a second grant application this summer to the Dayton Foundation to replace and extend the sidewalks in front of and on the north side of the Leiber Center.


Trustee Copley had no report.
