Regular Meeting
May 19, 2026

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville City Council was called to order by Mayor Letner at 7:30 p.m. on May 19, 2026. The meeting was held in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Members Crane, Fowler, Ledford, McNew, Piper; Manager Kuntz, Finance Director Brandt, Law Director Stephan, Police Chief Jerome and Clerk Duncan were present. Fire Chief Fletcher left prior to the start of the meeting to respond to an emergency call. Member Hughes was absent.

Roll call by Clerk Duncan.

Motion by Fowler, second by McNew to accept the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Piper, second by Ledford to accept the May 5, 2026 Special Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Fowler, second by Piper to accept the May 5, 2026 Regular Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Manager Kuntz reported the city's paving program is scheduled to kick off the first week of June and the Westbrook Resurfacing Project is scheduled to start on June 24. Information regarding the projects will be posted on the city's website and social media pages as we get closer to the date.

Manager Kuntz reported the next Third Thursday event is May 21 from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. at Gruenig Park and along Market Street. The event, hosted by Market Street Connection, will feature live entertainment, along with a free Kids Zone hosted by Brave Church. The Kids Zone will host a free petting zoo along with other fun games and activities. As always, the city's Historic Downtown Brookville DORA will also be open for refreshments, and plenty of local mobile vendors and food trucks will have food and beverages for purchase. Many of the downtown businesses will stay open during this event.

Manager Kuntz reminded everyone that the city office is closed on Monday, May 25 in observance of the Memorial Day holiday.

Manager Kuntz advised this meeting is very bittersweet for him as it is Clerk of Council Kim Duncan's last City Council meeting. Kim's last day as a city of Brookville employee is May 29. Kim has proudly served the city for 35 years in various capacities including in the police dispatch center, in administration as well as being the Clerk of Council since the beginning of 2020. Kim has been an important and vital part of City Council, serving as the administrative liaison between Council and the administrative operations of the city. Kim has done an unbelievable job carrying out those duties, while also carrying out her day-to-day administrative responsibilities. Manager Kuntz stated personally, Kim has been tremendous in helping him navigate his role as city manager since the beginning of 2024. Manager Kuntz thanked Kim for her time and dedication to the city and for everything she has helped him with over the past two and a half years, stating he hopes she and Don enjoy retirement life. Manager Kuntz reported that City Council is hosting a public open house for Kim on May 29 at the Brookville Fire Station from 1:00 p.m. until 3:00 p.m. and invited anyone that would like to come out and celebrate with Kim to do so.

Finance Director Brandt presented the Fund Balance of April 30, 2026 for Council review and approval.

Motion by Fowler, second by Piper to accept the Fund Balance of April 30, 2026 as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Police Chief Jerome reported the Police Department will escort the annual Ride to the Wall motorcycle riders through Brookville to AMVETS on May 20, 2026. The public is welcome to attend. Police Chief Jerome stated he is excited to announce that registration for the CSI camp planned for this summer is almost full.

Law Director Stephan congratulated Clerk Duncan on her retirement, thanking her for the many great years they have worked together.

Mayor Letner thanked Clerk Duncan for making him look better than he is, and for always making the city look good. Mayor Letner stated many things were navigated within the city during Kim's tenure, and the public may not realize what a smart lady she is. Mayor Letner emphasized what Kim brings to the table is amazing, and she has always done so with a smile on her face, even during rough times. Mayor Letner stressed he hates to see Kim go, but he is happy for her and wishes her the best.

Member Piper commented that Clerk Duncan has served the city and City Council honorably, taking care of whatever he has requested with just a phone call or email. Member Piper remarked the biggest role Kim has fulfilled for him is through her friendship that continues to grow. Member Piper stated Kim will truly be missed.

Member Fowler thanked Clerk Duncan for everything she has done for the city. Kim has been awesome and her departure will leave a hole.

The McKinley Street Bridge project has a change of work order in the amount \$9,897 for additional guard rails to be added to the sides of the bridge. This addition to the project will ensure the bridge remains safe for pedestrian traffic. Our Service Department worked with the contractor and the city's engineer and believes this is the most cost-effective option for this project. This is the final part of the project and will be considered completed after this is approved.

The city has received a Special Event Permit application for the annual Brookville Homecoming Parade. The parade organizers would like to have the parade on September 16 from 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm and the route will be the same as years past. The application has been sent to the police, fire and service departments and they have no concerns about the application request.

Reminder the city's street paving program is scheduled to start in June. The streets included with this year's program are:

- Flanders from Arlington Rd. to Studebaker Ct.
- Market from Jefferson St. to Salem St.
- Albert from Salem St. to Hay Ave.
- Church from Brookside Dr. to 52 Church

Residents will receive a letter prior to the project starting and "No Parking" signs will be posted 48 hours prior to construction beginning.

The city is partnering with the Brookville Area Chamber of Commerce and the Small Business Administration, offering free business classes for the Brookville area business community. The first class is scheduled for June 22 and will cover how businesses can use AI technology to increase productivity and save time. The second class is scheduled for July 27 and will cover cyber security for small businesses. Both classes are free for Brookville area businesses and Chamber members. Classes will run from 8 am- 11 am and will be at the Brookville Fire Station. Interested parties can go to the Chamber website or city's social media pages to register.

Finally, I'd like to welcome Joy Eyler to the city as our newest Clerk of Council. Joy brings a wealth of professional experience to the city and we're excited to have her here and working with us for the City of Brookville.

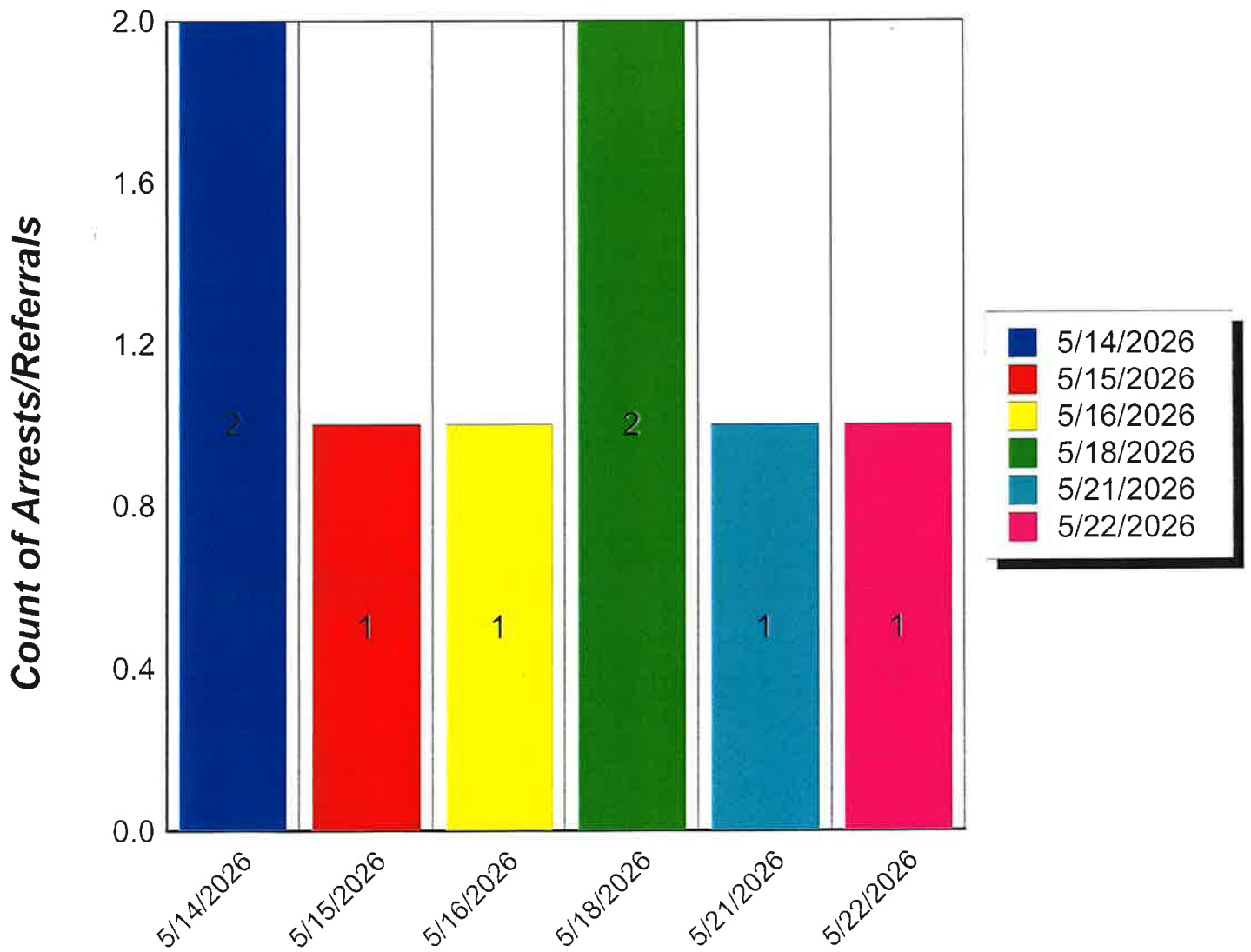

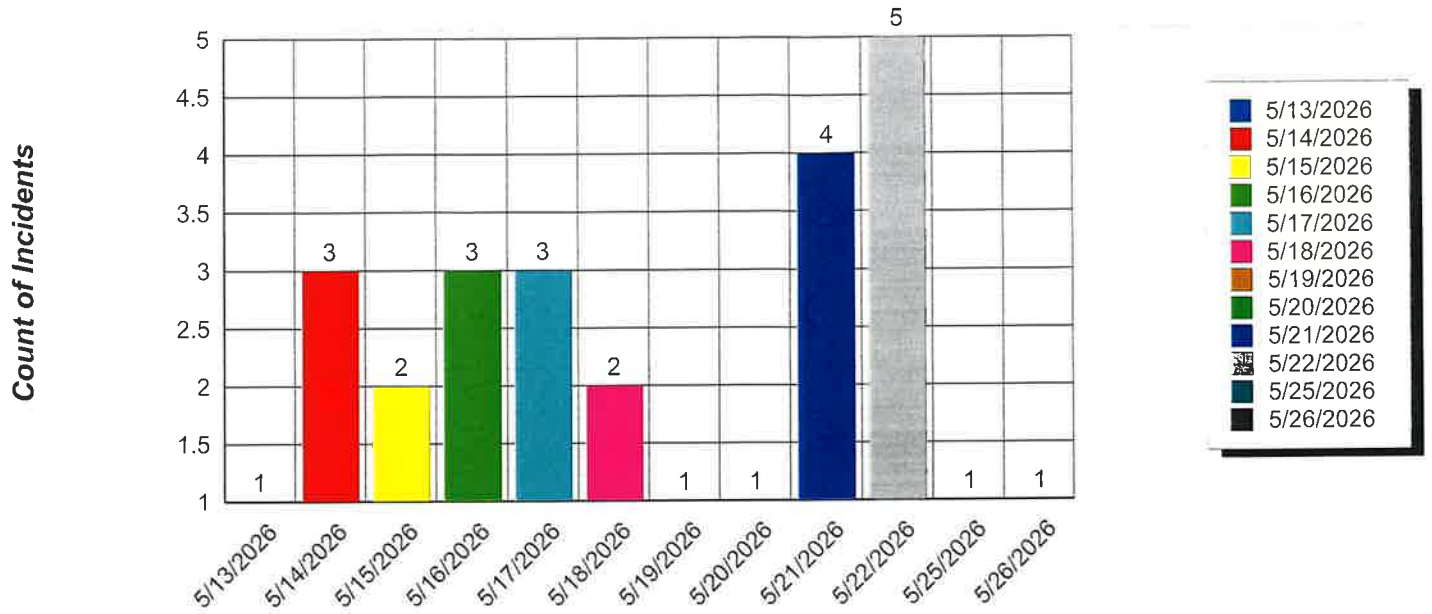

RE: CHARTER AMENDMENTS

City Council had requested additional charter amendments be prepared, and this Memorandum sets forth proposed revisions:

In Section 3.01, the following sentence would be added to the existing restriction on serving more than two terms

On January 1, 2017, and thereafter, all members of Council, including the Mayor, shall not be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms as a Council Member or Mayor, however, a Council Member may serve two consecutive terms as a Council Member and then may serve two consecutive terms as Mayor.

In Section 4.06 the following sentence would be added:

Resolutions or Ordinances accepting a petition for annexation of territory after approval of the annexation by the Board of County Commissioners shall be read two times and shall only be passed as an emergency measure on the second reading of the Ordinance or Resolution accepting the petition for annexation of territory.

With respect to scheduling of Council Meetings, the current proposed change to Sec. 3.07 (B) would require only one regular meeting be scheduled each month. This revision would provide City Council with the flexibility to schedule only one meeting in a month for any reason.

RESOLUTION NO. 26-10

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A NEW WAGE SCALE FOR SEASONAL AND/OR TEMPORARY, AND PERMANENT PART-TIME HOURLY CITY EMPLOYEES.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOKVILLE, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION I: The following constitutes the wage scale for seasonal and/or temporary, and permanent part-time hourly employees of the City of Brookville, Ohio and shall take effect the pay period that includes May 30, 2026:

SECTION II: All seasonal and/or temporary, and permanent part-time will be placed according to their training, qualifications and experience into one of the step “levels” based on the Department Head’s decision and approved by the City Manager. Any progression from any step to another step, will be based upon satisfactory performance evaluation, and the need for such step level as determined by the Department Head and approval by the City Manager.

SECTION III: City of Brookville Fire Department variable hour employees participating in voluntary activities, such as details, meetings, community activities and supervisory positions (Officer Pay), shall be eligible to receive a quarterly stipend for their volunteer service.

The quarterly stipend for all activities, not including Officer Pay, shall not exceed \$270 per quarter, per employee.

The Supervisory stipend, Officer Pay, shall not exceed \$175.00 quarterly for any Captain, or \$135.00 quarterly for any Lieutenant.

SECTION IV: If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Resolution is found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall affect only such clause, sentence, section or part of this Resolution and shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or other parts of this Resolution. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Council of the City of Brookville that this Resolution would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

SECTION V: This Resolution shall revoke and rescind any Resolution that is in conflict herewith.
