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Brookville Board of Park Trustees
Regular Meeting
July 14, 2026

The Regular Meeting of the Brookville Board of Park Trustees was called to order by President Blevins at 7:30 p.m. on May 12, 2026 in the City Council Chambers. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Trustees Blevins, Copley, and Wilson; Manager Kuntz and Clerk Eyler were present. Trustee Hunt was absent.

Roll Call by President Blevins.

Motion by Wilson, second by Copley to accept the Agenda as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Motion by Hunt, second by Copley to accept the June 9, 2026 Meeting Minutes as presented. All yeas, motion carried.

Manager Kuntz reported the CDBG sidewalk project is complete and has been submitted for reimbursement.

Manager Kuntz reported the Boy Scout storage building is with Montgomery County for final permitting.

Manager Kuntz reported the city will be receiving \$150,000 from the state of Ohio for Phase II of the inclusive playground, and the final admin agreement is forthcoming.

Manager Kuntz reported there has been a donation of playground equipment for Ward Park.

Manager Kuntz reported that a CDBG grant has been awarded to place exercise equipment at Westbrook Park.

Manager Kuntz reported there is a private donor who would like to sponsor 3 projects, \$50,000 each, he asked that the Park Board consider their top 3 projects so they can decide which projects the money will go towards, will discuss further at next meeting.

Manager Kuntz stated that the Kiwanis Club's Little Library Project in Golden Gate Park has been completed.

Manager Kunt reported that the Service Department has recently added additional concrete benches around the new concrete tables at Gruenig Park. He also noted that a local downtown business is looking to donate a picnic table.

Manager Kuntz reported that AES had to cut down a few trees in Ward Park as part of their power line upgrade project.

Manager Kuntz reported that Age Friendly Brookville is having their monthly Lunch & Learn Wednesday, July 15 at the Leiber Center. Brookhaven is sponsoring the event providing a free lunch and the guest speaker will be Capt. Ferguson who will discuss fire and life safety tips for seniors.

Manager Kuntz announced the next Third Thursday is July 16 at Gruenig Park and Market Street in Historic Downtown Brookville. There are going to be loads of local mobile vendors, live entertainment this month as well as Brave Church's free kids zone which will be luau themed with fun games and activities!

Manager Kuntz reported that we are looking forward to the 75th annual Community Picnic this year at Golden Gate Park, held by the Brookville Area Chamber of Commerce. The event runs from July 23-25. Our Service Department has been busy getting the park ready for the event. Manager Kuntz thanked the Service Department for their hard work and dedication to having the park ready for this huge event.

Trustee Copley stated that there is graffiti on benches and picnic tables at Ward Park that need covered up. Manger Kuntz will have the Service Department work on it right away.

Trustee Wilson stated that Golden Gate Park looks really nice.

President Blevins stated that all the parks look really good and that even with the heat the kids are out enjoying the skate park.

Trustee Copley reported that the Brookville Chamber of Commerce has donated the booth space for the Park Board to have a presence at this year's Community Picnic. Trustee Copley would like to purchase items that light up for the community to purchase for a \$2 donation. They will have a QR code to be used for payment as well as cash. All donations will go towards Christmas in the Park. She proposed that Park Board use MOU funds to cover the purchase of the items.

Motion by Copley, second by Wilson to use \$450 MOU money to purchase items available for donation. All yeas, motion carried.
